**Grade(s): First and Second**

<p><b>Objective (1st Grade):</b> The student will investigate and understand that plants have life needs and functional parts and can be classified according to certain characteristics. They will also investigate and understand that natural resources are limited.</p> <p><b>Objective (2nd Grade):</b> The student will investigate and understand that living things are part of a system.
